#### FIRST NATIONS CULTURE


Head ashore to come face to face with the region's indigenous past, meeting First Nations people and taking in 5,000-year-old petroglyphs.

# MV Cascadia EXPEDITION-STYLE CATAMARAN

Skimming the wilds of the British Columbia coast, this light, spacious and steel-hulled catamaran is a true go-anywhere explorer of these far-flung shores. And, kitted out with the likes of kayaks, custom tenders and a helipad complete with an A-Star heli, she's a catamaran perfectly poised for an expedition of Canada's western reaches.

Of course, that's not to suggest that Cascadia forgoes a touch of elegance and contemporary comfort, too. As well as her small size and guest numbers, an extensive refit has seen this catamaran's interior transformed with the likes of outdoor lounges, an open bridge and a series of well-appointed cabins complete with outside deck and private en suites.

There's also a supremely comfortable lounge, living and dining area, adorned with sink-worthy couches and a library lined with binoculars and wildlife books to hand. And, there's even a massage room for added indulgence, along with a top-deck hot tub – complete with 360° views – for the ultimate in downtime relaxation.
